Feeding Program

In 2023, Islamic Ummah Relief (IUR) continued its pivotal Feeding Program, a fundamental aspect of our humanitarian endeavors targeting the nutritional needs of widows, orphans, and vulnerable families in Ghana, Nigeria, Niger, and Uganda. Aligned with the United Nations Sustainable Development Goal 2 (Zero Hunger), this program holds particular significance during key Islamic events such as Ramadan, Qurbani, and Eid, as well as on globally recognized days like World Food Day and World Orphan Day.

Throughout the year, IUR successfully conducted feeding activities across all the countries we operate in, ensuring essential food items reached those most in need. These distributions, meticulously organized and executed, provided vital food packs to hundreds of widows and vulnerable families in each activity. The commitment to conducting these programs during significant Islamic events underscores our dedication to meeting the cultural and religious needs of our beneficiaries.

For the first time in 2023, IUR expanded its Feeding Program to the United States, reaching out to the homeless population in New York City. This extension of our efforts reflects our commitment to addressing hunger on a global scale and adapting our programs to meet the needs of diverse communities. In addition to distributing food, we also provided water, recognizing the importance of addressing basic needs for those facing homelessness.

Orphanage Project & Orphan Support Program

We continue to make a meaningful impact through our dedicated Orphanage Project and Orphan support programs, specifically targeting the northern regions of Ghana and Nigeria—areas often marked by severe poverty and hunger. Recognizing the unique challenges faced by orphans in these communities, IUR has undertaken a multifaceted approach to provide essential support and nurture the well-being of these vulnerable children. Our commitment to ensuring the happiness of orphans is evident in our support initiatives during festive occasions such as Eid. During these times of celebration, IUR extends its reach to provide food and clothing for orphaned children, aiming to offer them reasons to experience joy comparable to their peers



from more advantaged backgrounds and families. Notably, we contribute sewn clothing for the two Eids, enhancing the festive experience for these deserving youngsters.



On a larger scale, IUR has embarked on the ambitious Orphan Village project—an initiative designed to establish a holistic support system for orphans in need. This village encompasses a school with well-equipped classrooms, dormitories, a sick bay, a library, and sports/recreational facilities. The vision goes beyond providing immediate needs to the orphans from a distance; it aspires to create a nurturing environment that directly houses and cares for these children. In 2023, significant strides were made in the development of the Orphan Village, reaching the finishing stages that include painting, landscaping, and the installation of electrical and plumbing systems. This substantial progress lays the foundation for the realization of our goal to open the Orphan Village toward the end of 2024. The upcoming year holds the promise of continued advancement, as we remain steadfast in our commitment to providing a secure and supportive haven for orphans in the regions we serve.

The Orphanage Project and the orphan support programs exemplify IUR's dedication to creating lasting positive change in the lives of vulnerable children, reinforcing our commitment to Sustainable Development Goals I (No Poverty) and 4 (Quality Education). Through these initiatives, we strive not only to meet the immediate needs of orphans but also to empower them with the tools and environment necessary for a brighter future.



We continue to be steadfast in our commitment to Education & Empowerment, focusing on a targeted skills program designed specifically for widows in Ghana, Nigeria, Togo, and Uganda. Recognizing the unique challenges faced by widows, particularly in regions where the traditional role of the father as the family's primary provider is prevalent, IUR aims to empower these women with practical skills, enabling them to achieve self-sufficiency. The objective of this project is clear: to equip widows with valuable skills that not only enhance their personal development but also provide a means for them to support themselves and their families independently. In many parts of Africa, including the areas we serve, the unfortunate loss of the family's breadwinner leaves widows with I imited skills and financial resources to navigate life's challenges.

Throughout 2023, IUR dedicated time to planning and strategizing, aiming to enhance the effectiveness and impact of the skills program. This period of reflection has allowed us to identify areas for improvement and implement new initiatives that will further empower widows in the coming year. We take pride in the proactive steps taken to refine our approach and look forward to implementing these initiatives to better address the specific needs of widows in the communities we serve.

Our commitment to Education & Empowerment remains unwavering as we strive to make a lasting impact on the lives of widows, aligning with Sustainable Development Goal 4 (Quality Education) and Goal 5 (Gender Equality). By providing practical skills and support, IUR endeavors to break the cycle of dependency and foster self-sufficiency, empowering widows to build a more secure and resilient future for themselves and their families.



In a transformative mission trip to Katsina, Nigeria, Islamic Ummah Relief (IUR) demonstrated its commitment to hands-on engagement and community impact. A dedicated team of executives visited the site of the Orphanage Village, inspecting the progress of the project, and engaging in fruitful discussions with the site engineer to ensure the project's timely completion. This trip went beyond overseeing the construction; it became an opportunity for the team to witness the tangible impact of their efforts on the ground.

Amidst their visit, the team extended their commitment to community development by overseeing the construction of two water wells in Batagarawa and Kaita. During these visits, the team immersed themselves in the communities, experiencing profound moments that reinforced the significance of their work. They encountered an aging well built in 1969, now dry, and witnessed the joy emanating from community members as a new water well took shape. Another poignant encounter involved two brothers crafting cutlery for their community, with the older brother shaping metals and the younger one, blissfully unaware, playing with a "wheel" that fueled the fire for their craft. The brothers' excitement at the prospect of a new water source added a layer of hope to the community.

Additionally, the mission team visited a government-operated orphanage and a school for the blind, donating essential food items to these institutions. This act of generosity reflected IUR's commitment to uplifting the lives of those in need, extending compassion and support to marginalized communities. Furthermore, the team hosted a soccer tournament for young children in one of the communities, providing medals for each participant and a trophy for the winning team—a gesture that went beyond physical nourishment to nourish the spirits of the young participants.

Looking ahead to 2024, IUR has planned another visit to inaugurate the Orphan Village, marking a significant milestone in their commitment to providing a secure and nurturing environment for orphans. Moreover, there are aspirations to organize mission trips involving volunteers from the United States, fostering global collaboration and collective efforts in humanitarian endeavors.

This mission trip exemplified IUR's dedication to creating lasting, positive change by not only overseeing ongoing projects but also actively engaging with communities and addressing their immediate needs. These impactful experiences underscore the organization's commitment to its mission and serve as a catalyst for continued efforts to make a meaningful difference in the lives of those in underserved communities.
